We offer certificates in:

- Career Exploration
- Kitchen Assistant
- Retail Assistant

All certificates run September to May and involve a combination of classroom study, experiential learning, and practicum placements.

When should you apply?

Deadline to apply is May 31.

The ESTR program has limited enrollment. Submit your completed application package to the TRU Admissions Office (OM1155) early to be considered for the next academic year.

Criteria

Our primary considerations are:

- Attitude and a desire to work
- Independence and previous work or volunteer experience
- Literacy level and reading comprehension
- Ability to communicate effectively
- Ability to manage own transportation to and from TRU work placements off campus

How much will it cost?

- Tuition, per certificate: \$4,000*
- Textbooks and supplies: \$500*

CAREER EXPLORATION

Students further develop employability skills and acquire recognized certificates for entry-level employment.

Students learn:

- Customer service
- Communication skills
- Employer expectations
- WHMIS
- Job search strategies
- Self and community awareness
- Workplace health and safety
- Teamwork

Graduates may choose to go on to other educational programs, or directly into entry-level employment.

KITCHEN ASSISTANT

Students train in TRU kitchens.

Students learn:

- Customer service
- Food preparation methods
- Set-up and organization of a kitchen
- Creating edible products, portioning, and packaging
- Kitchen cleanup and sanitation
- Food Safe Level 1 and safe work practice
- Teamwork

Graduates are prepared for employment in restaurants, fast-food outlets, institutional kitchens and catering businesses.

RETAIL ASSISTANT

Students train in TRU retail and warehouse areas.

Students learn:

- Customer service
- Warehouse procedures
- Facing, pricing, stocking shelves and displaying
- Point of sales system training
- Inventory management
- Security and safe work practices
- Teamwork

Graduates are prepared for employment in warehouses, grocery stores, department stores and customer service areas.
