

The Bachelor of Kinesiology at UBC is a four-year program that can start a career in Kinesiology, active health research, education, recreation, or sports. While the core courses are consistent in Years 1 and 2 for all students, there are three streams available for Years 3 and 4. See page 2 for descriptions of the streams.

Direct admission to Year 1 of the B. Kin requires the following high school courses:

- Any English Language Arts 11 **and** one of English Studies 12 or English First Peoples 12
- One of Pre-Calculus 12, Biology or A&P 12, Chemistry 12 or Physics 12
- Language 11 or waiver;
- Science 11 or Science 12
- One of Pre-Calculus 11 or Foundations of Math 12

Transfer students must also meet these requirements or post-secondary equivalent courses.

* Careful planning of electives is required depending on educational goals and the different streams. Future enrolment in Bachelor of Education, Physical Education, Medicine, Physical Therapy, and Occupational Therapy are some potential future goals.

GPA REQUIREMENT: Admission is very competitive and transfer students should be prepared to have a competitive GPA of at least 3.5 (on a 4.0 scale) calculated on a minimum of 24 transferable credits or the most recent 30 credits. STREAMS (descriptions from UBC website):

NEUROMECHANICAL and PHYSIOLOGICAL SCIENCES: The courses in this stream will explore human structure and function responsible for movement; from the physiological, neural, mechanical, and behavioural mechanisms and their interactions, to how these components affect and are affected by factors such as physical activity, aging, and disease.

SOCIAL and BEHAVIOURAL SCIENCES: The courses in this stream will examine psychosocial, historical, and cultural understanding of sport, physical activity and health behaviour and its impact on individuals and within societies.

MULTI-DISCIPLINARY SCIENCE: Students registered in this stream will choose courses from the mechanical, physiological, psychological, sociological, and pedagogical branches of kinesiology, thereby designing a cross-disciplinary program of study.
