Part I: Summary from the SL Coordinator – Elizabeth Templeman

This was a record year for SL in two ways: taking on the biggest team of new leaders (12), and piloting the most courses in a single year (6). The new leaders trained well and contributed a great deal, with all but one continuing through the year and into the next. It was also an tough year in terms of financial challenges students face, with most leaders taking on outside jobs, some for as many as 30 hours/week. This was the reason one leader dropped out after her first term—another first for SL.

The uptake was lower than we expected. This may be in part due to students still recovering from the complications of COVID, still adjusting to being on campus, and also dealing with those financial challenges. Another challenge has been scheduling sessions which work for students, with timetables appearing to be less patterned and predictable than they were in the past.

The team persisted, however, with participation gradually increasing in many courses. As always, I observed students in sessions greatly enjoying the collaborative and productive atmosphere, and the opportunity for guided study. Results were positive for all courses, I'm pleased to note, and each pilot proved to be, at some level, a success.

Participation & Outcomes

Over the two semesters of 2023-24, SL supported twenty-three single semester courses. The following sections provide more details about participation and outcomes.
